So I came back to SPU again, this time for Internship, and I hope that I can learn more. I am so happy and excited to return to SPU, it is my first time to go abroad for internship. I have many different experiences. Internship at SPU is not a hard job. I started my work by helping with the Chinese teaching activities with volunteering students from Kun Shan university. I am currently double majoring in Urban Planning and Globalization at Albany University, New York. I chose to intern in Thailand because I want to experience working at a megacity I did not get to choose SPU at first because I was assigned by an agency. However, until now, I have never regretted to accept this option and if I have a chance to work at SPU again, I would not hesitate to do so. Here I work as a research intern at the CISR of Architecture Department. I am currently working on a research paper about housing policy in Vietnam and this research paper will be one of the references for Klong Teoy Slum Upgrading Project in Bangkok. Working at SPU has given me not only hands-on experience in my field but it has built a bridge connecting me with local students by extra curriculum activities besides urban planning. Through these activities, I could learn more about Thai people and culture.

I believe that culture makes a country unique. Culture is including language, religious affiliations, philosophy, family structure and social hierarchy. I am lucky to lived and worked in three different countries: Vietnam, America and Thailand. Vietnam's and Thailand's cultures are guite similar because they both adopt Buddhism, they strictly follow the social hierarchy and they show high respectfulness towards the elders. However, Vietnam is influenced by Chinese Buddhism and Confusianism whereas Thailand adopts primary Buddhism from India. Hence, the languages and philosophy in both countries are somehow different. On the other hand, the America is a liberal country. In America, people follow the supreme constitution of free speech and the rights of equality. The Americans are free to choose their religious affiliations and to say what they think without any prohibitions. The America is also a hub of immigration, thereby, it's culture is very diverse.

When I get back to the US or to Vietnam, I would highly recommend my family to visit Thailand . I would also introduce CISR for my friends to apply for internship if they are interested in working in urban planning field.

I am second-year graduate student at the University of Florida studying Urban and Regional Planning. I have always enjoyed travelling and taking on new experiences. An internship abroad would be interesting as it can potentially set me apart from my classmates when looking for work. Internship at School of Architecture, Sripatum University, Instead of pushing papers around, I am actually doing research – something I have experience in – in an area. I believe a research internship was a good fit for me and will help me progress into a city or private planning internship/job later.

I really enjoy the program, I think Dr. Nattawut Usavagovitwong, Director of the Center for Integrated Socio-Spatial Research (CISR) has done a great job of balancing the needed experience for us with the objectives and results one would expect from an internship. I basically have two different assignments. The first assignment and primary assignment is our day-to-day tasks of researching housing policies in Southeast Asia. The second assignment is more complementary to the first. It focuses on implementing communicative planning practices within communities outside of Bangkok and excluding those highly successful beach towns.

Interning at Sripatum University, there are two main advantages with my participation; one is that this is international experience that sets me apart from my colleagues/competition; and two,

I am doing action research with meaningful tasks. The international

experience puts me in a different, unfamiliar, and challenging environment that I need to learn, adjust, and solve in different manners than I am used to – something potential employers may find attractive about myself. The second aspect of action research seems to be beneficial and meaningful in what I am doing. The opportunity to be exposed to this type of work has been the greatest thing I have gained. This is all much to credit of Dr. Nattawut Usavagovitwong, the School of Architecture, and SPU.

Living in Thailand, I found Thai people are extremely nice and welcoming. People in America are much more standoff-ish. Here, everyone wants to help you with directions, say "hi", or make sure you have more than enough food to fill your bellies. There is a genuine interest for people-to-people interactions. I will tell my family and friends about how it was all worth interning and living in Thailand! How I visited a devastated floating market and discussed challenges their economies face; how I hiked the most beautiful Khao Yai National Park and saw a Gibbons gracefully swinging from tree to tree or the majesty of seeing a hornbilled bird's pure size soar 50ft above us; the kindest host mother that wanted to make me fat with the amount of food she served; the impromptu public speech I had to give to community leaders; the struggle to pronounce anything in Thai; riding a motorcycle to work; the international event at SPU where we did a group activity with the students; or the teachers and interns I interacted with on a daily basis. There are many experiences I will never forget, all of them unique in their own way.
